Official Information Act (1982) Request

I write in response to your Official Information Act request, dated 04 September 2019. You requested the following information:

Of the \$3,097,603 that the Counties Manukau DHB received from the Official Development Assistance programme in 2018,

- how much has been spent on to date,
- and what specific activities has this been spent on, or is planned to be spent on?

Please refer below for the specific details related to the NZ Medical Treatment Scheme (NZMTS), noting that the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT) is also responding to you on this request, and has confirmed high level allocation of the total funds to Counties Manukau District Health Board (CMDHB) via the Vote: Official Development Assistance (ODA) scheme (table 1). These are the funding amounts and allocations agreed with us in the FY 2018.19.

This contract funds CMDHB to coordinate, fund and administer three (3) components of NZMTS support to six Pacific Island (Fiji, Kiribati, Samoa, Tonga, Tuvalu and Vanuatu).

The components are a) Overseas Medical Referrals, b) Visiting Medical Specialists, and c) Strengthening In-country Capacity initiatives. The elements of each of these is summarised **(table 2)** below. A significant focus is on the Pacific Child Health I.N.F.A.N.T.S training programme in each of the islands.

We note that this Agreement is a multi-year commitment, and some funding amounts below will reflect arrangements in place from prior years, and Agreement Variations in the total period from 2017-2021.
