

Official Information Act Request for - Covid Patient Fiji

I write in response to your Official Information Act request received by us 3rd August 2021, you requested the following information:

 All communication between CMDHB, Ministry of Health, and any other parties regarding the medevac of a Covid patient from Fiji last week.

Counties Manukau Health Response:

For context Counties Manukau Health (CM Health) employs over 8,500 staff and provides health and support services to people living in the Counties Manukau region (approx. 601,490 people). We see over 118,000 people in our Emergency Department each year, and over 2,000 visitors come through Middlemore Hospital daily.

Our services are delivered via hospital, outpatient, ambulatory and community-based models of care. We provide regional and supra-regional specialist services i.e. for orthopaedics, plastics, burns and spinal services. There are also several specialist services provided including tertiary surgical services, medical services, mental health and addiction services.

The metro Auckland DHBs (Counties Manukau, Waitematā and Auckland) work together collaboratively to share demand for patient care across the region. Counties Manukau Health has well-developed processes for the management of COVID-19 patients at our hospitals. During June and July 2021, there were capacity constraints in our ICU as a result of a Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) outbreak.

On receiving the initial referral request to accept the transfer of a Covid positive patient from Fiji, the Counties-Manukau DHB Chief Medical Officer agreed to accept the transfer subject to agreement by the clinical treating teams accepting care of the patient. Given concerns raised by the Middlemore Hospital ICU clinical leadership the transfer was then declined. Subsequently, after receiving additional information about the patient, their clinical situation and the situation on the ground in Fiji and further discussion involving all the Auckland metro ICUs clinical leadership there was unanimous service agreement to receive the patient into an Auckland ICU. The determination of the ultimate ICU destination was challenging given the capacity and specialist nature of the hospital ICUs.

We have attached as appendix 1, to the best of our knowledge communication you have requested above. CM Health has withheld the following under the following sections of the Official Information Act 1982:

- Information to protect the privacy of the natural persons under section 9(2)(a) of the Official Information Act 1982 protect the privacy of the natural persons, including that of deceased natural persons.
- Information between any international organisation under section 6(b)(ii) of the Official Information Act 1982 to prejudice the entrusting of information to the Government of New Zealand on a basis of confidence by any international organisation.
- Information that is commercially sensitive under section 9(2)(b)(ii) of the Official Information Act 1982 would be likely unreasonably to prejudice the commercial position of the person who supplied or who is the subject of the information.
- Information to protect international relations under section 6(a) of the Official Information Act 1982 to prejudice the security or defence of New Zealand or the international relations of the Government of New Zealand.
- Information to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through the free and frank expression of opinions under section 9(2)(g)(i) of the Official Information Act 1982 the free and frank expression of opinions by or between or to Ministers of the Crown or members of an organisation or officers and employees of any public service agency or organisation in the course of their duty.

In addition, we have excluded some administrative emails, for example, double-ups of the same email.

I trust this information answers your request. You are entitled to seek a review of the response by the Ombudsman under section 28(3) of the Official Information Act. Information about how to make a complaint is available at www.ombudsman.parliament.nz or Freephone 0800 802 602.

Please note that this response or an edited version of this may be published on the Counties Manukau Health website. If you consider there are good reasons why this response should not be made publicly available, we will be happy to consider this.





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

The patient will be transferred directly to Intensive Care on arrival via the ambulance bay at Middlemore. She will be nursed in a negative pressure room. Once moved out of ICU she will be cared for on our COVID ward in negative pressure until discharged, if greater than 14 days we will arrange her transfer home, if prior to 14 days (unlikely) she will go to Jet Park. Discharge planning depends on her status.

Thanks for agreeing to meet with us.	

To summarise our conversation and position regarding the request for assistance from Fiji for the transfer and treatment of the COVID positive case; as an ICU team we do not accept this patient into our Intensive Care. The reasons we discussed are as follows.

- There are significant ethical issues raised in accepting this patient in these circumstances.
 We do not sually offer intensive care therapy to Fijian citizens. Our primary
 responsibility is providing intensive care to patients within our area, and to New Zealand
 citizens outside our area at our discretion. She is not the only patient seriously ill with
 Covid in Fiji. To offer care to this patient is inequitable, potentially sets a precedent, and
 compromises our ability to care for Counties patients.
- 2. As a unit we are concerned about the impact on our ability to care for Counties patients. Currently South Auckland is experiencing high levels of RSV infection in the paediatric population. We need to be able manage and treat this population for the foreseeable future. The school holidays have provided a 'fire-break' for us to regroup but we expect that the numbers will continue to increase in the next few weeks. Second to this is the need to be available to provide both a national spinal and burns service which by their very nature is unpredictable.
- 3. Finally, there is a significant staff welfare consideration. We expect our staff to place themselves in risky positions in the course of their work. This particular virus also places the staff's family in harm's way. Despite appropriate PPE and good vaccination rates the

risk to the community and families of staff is not zero, particularly as we now understand the increased transmissibility of the Delta variant. Our staff are vaccinated, but their families are not. Staff welfare remains a primary concern for us and we have had it voiced by a number of staff members that they would find this risk unacceptably high, we know that staff distress and anxiety results in increased sick leave, and this will further reduce our capacity to care for patients of South Auckland.

This position is supported by the intensive care team at the Department of Critical Care (DCC) at Auckland Hospital. They have been asked for a second opinion regarding our position. DCC would not admit this patient to their unit for the ethical reasons discussed. DCC have discussed their position with the chair of the Auckland City Hospital ethics committee, and will urgent ethics committee meeting to discuss this issue should they be referred this patient. DCC have also said that they will not support or assist us with any capacity issues that develop flowing on from a decision to accept this patient. Given we rely heavily on DCC and PICU when patient occupancy and acuity escalates this is a major consideration. Dr was the point of contact at DCC if you wish to contact her, and I understand that Dr has also voiced an opinion that they would not accept this patient.

I have asked to respond to me their position in writing, and I will forward this email to you when I receive it.

Moving forward I do feel that we should use this opportunity to either join the Auckland ethics committee or convene a local group to discuss issues such as this as this will undoubtedly not be the first request for assistance.



I am writing to you regarding an urgent situation for a COVID + patient from Fiji seeking medical treatment in NZ. I have spoken with our CMO this morning and we agreed it would be best to contact you directly. (By way of background/introductionl my role at the Ministry is focused on our international work).

The Ministry understands that DHBs will accept medical transfers from overseas on taking into consideration two important issues: 1) when there is a clinical assessment that treatment in NZ is necessary/appropriate and 2) when there is capacity in the NZ health system to accept the patient. In the case of a COVID + patient, the issue of safe transfer that protects the NZ population is a third important issue. (On this third issue, we understand that a safe travel plan was fully scoped yesterday)

In the case of the current COVID + patient from Fiji, we are seeking information/assurance that the 3 important considerations have been fully exhausted. We appreciate that providing this info may require convening ICU/ethics heads for a quick discussion. Attributable to a Ministry of Health spokesperson:

Health authorities have approved a formal request for the transfer and treatment of a patient from Fiji who has tested positive for Covid-19.

The Ministry's approval follows agreement by the metro-Auckland DHBs to treat the patient, and a transfer plan approved by a Medical Officer of Health from the Auckland Regional Public Health Service and agreed to by New Zealand Air Ambulance Service.

The plan takes into consideration the safety of both the patient and the crew who will be transporting the patient.

The metro-Auckland DHBs are working in an extremely busy and dynamic environment, due in part to higher than normal presentations of RSV and winter illness. The receiving hospital is yet to be confirmed, and will be determined by the treatment required by the patient and the capacity in the respective Intensive Care Units.

There are appropriate isolation and infection prevention and control plans in place at all the metro-


DHB hospitals to accommodate this patient.

The approval follows a request for specialist treatment in New Zealand. Requests for medical treatment in New Zealand from overseas jurisdictions, particularly in the Pacific, are common. Every request is considered, carefully taking into account factors such as the clinical needs of the patient, whether safe transport can be arranged and the availability of care in New Zealand.


While this request was initially declined for capacity reasons, the metro-Auckland DHB ICUs have now confirmed this treatment can be provided. The region will continue to work closely together to manage capacity issues.

The medevac flight will leave New Zealand this morning and return this afternoon.

The Ministry of Health has an obligation to protect a patient's privacy and is not able to provide further details.





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


