Official Information Act Request for – Nga Hau Birthing Centre

I write in response to your Official Information Act request received by us 15th December 2021, you requested the following information:

- 1. This is an Official Information Act request for all documents or reports, including emails or correspondence around proposals for funding or support, between the Ngā Hau Māngere Birthing Centre and the Counties Manukau District Health Board since the birthing centre was first proposed.
- 2. I also request any internal reports or reviews into the Ngā Hau Māngere Birthing Centre, it's performance, funding or approaches by it's staff or owners, in the same time frame.

Counties Manukau Health Response:

For context Counties Manukau Health (CM Health) employs over 8,500 staff and provides health and support services to people living in the Counties Manukau region (approx. 601,490 people). We see over 118,000 people in our Emergency Department each year, and over 2,000 visitors come through Middlemore Hospital daily.

Our services are delivered via hospital, outpatient, ambulatory and community-based models of care. We provide regional and supra-regional specialist services i.e. for orthopaedics, plastics, burns and spinal services. There are also several specialist services provided including tertiary surgical services, medical services, mental health and addiction services.

1. This is an Official Information Act request for all documents or reports, including emails or correspondence around proposals for funding or support, between the Ngā Hau Māngere Birthing Centre and the Counties Manukau District Health Board since the birthing centre was first proposed.

Attached as appendix 1 is all correspondence about requests for funding or discussion of support between Nga Hau Mangere Birthing Centre and CM Health.

2. I also request any internal reports or reviews into the Ngā Hau Māngere Birthing Centre, it's performance, funding or approaches by it's staff or owners, in the same time frame. CM Health has not conducted any reviews or produced any internal reports about Nga Hau Mangere Birthing Centre. I trust this information answers your request. You are entitled to seek a review of the response by the Ombudsman under section 28(3) of the Official Information Act. We are excited to connect with you on behalf of the Nga Hau Mangere Birthing Centre and the Wright Foundation. Our purpose is to engage with you on the potential opportunity for Nga Hau to transition into a *Pasifika midwifery led Primary maternity hub*.

New Zealand is experiencing a change in its health care system and we know that the inequities for Pasifika peoples need to change. The Ministry of Health report *O Manuia* (2020) highlights the impact of the system that our Pasifika peoples currently face and is supported by the recently published *Bula Sautu* Report 2021. Mangere is one of the most concentrated Pasifika populations with 59.4% identifying as Pasifika and 16.4% Maori Panifika. A Pasifika midwifery led primary hub would resonate with the community and also reflect their values.

We would like to meet with you and talanoa on the potential to see a thriving and flourishing Pasifika midwifery led Primary maternity hub based at Nga Hau Māngere. Attached is an outline of the Nga Hau Māngere Pasifika Midwives and a high-level strategic map. Our talanoa would approximately be 45 minutes and we would use this feedback to make recommendations on the viability of this proposal to the Sector Management at Nga Hau Māngere Birthing Centre.

Hi Tish

The decision you are referring to below about transfers from Middlemore to Nga Hau sits with your organisation alone. I am not sure what you mean by 'NHBC has not permitted any transfers back from Middlemore'. This would obviously be a very rare occurrence.

We have not put any barriers in place for women wishing to birth at Middlemore during COVID Lockdown periods. Each woman is screened and managed on a case by case basis and as you mention, we have strong infection control practices.

From our perspective, once women are discharged from Middlemore they can go there they wish unless they are required under the Health Act to go back to a quarantine centre if COVID positive

Alan Greenslade has shared the media requested response. Dear Chloe Thank you for your email.

Of the 7727 women who birth office District, less than 900 women are choosing to birth in primary birthing units or at home each year. The current birthing units have capacity to manage up to 500 to 700 births per annum per unit.

CM Health has two standalone birthing centres in Papakura and Botany, a primary birthing unit at Pukekohe Hospital and primary birthing at Middlemore Hospital. At this stage, the DHB does not have the resources to fund more private birthing capacity than is required for the population. A greater proportion of Counties Manukau women need to birth at Middlemore due to the increased complexity of pregnancies in the population.

The DHB recently expanded maternity capacity for antenatal services offered at Middlemore Hospital and Manukau Healthpark. We have also recently begun a primary birthing project which is in the process of co-designing new models of service delivery and reviewing our facilities. This project is committed to codesign of services with women and their whanau. Our first area of focus is Papakura Birthing Unit where we are working with lwi to explore future cultural models for primary birthing. This locality is priority because of population growth and the age of the Birthing Unit that is over 70 years old.

At this point, we are not in a position to enter into any procurement for non DHB services. With the upcoming changes to the health care landscape, we are focusing on progressing current initiatives rather than beginning new relationships.

I would also like to correct a point you made in your email for accuracy. Nga Hau does not take more women or exceed births at both Botany Downs and Papakura combined. The birth numbers at both those units is actually double the births at Nga Hau from March 2020 to March 2021 and a very high volume of postnatal women are also accommodated at all our primary birthing units.

Mangere Birthing Centre, who are hoping to make more of its services I'm doing a story about Nga Har available to local women wher the Health NZ reforms.

I'm just wanting a reponse on why CMDHB has decided to not establish an access agreement with Nga Hau Mangere so wonten who have CMDHB-contracted midwives can use the rooms there?

- 1. Any agreement to use a private provider for any outsourcing of any public maternity services would be considered only after a government sanctioned procurement process was undertaken. We have not needed to undertake any such process as we currently have a number of primary birthing units.
- 2. Community LMCs are self employed and can use any premises for which they hold an access agreement.

(My understanding is that the ADHB has an agreement with Birthcare in Parnell where it leases rooms off Birthcare and then woman can stay there for a couple of nights for free - and Nga Hau Mangere would like something similar).

3. As mentioned above, any such contract would need to follow government services procurement processes. We are not undertaking any such exercise with anyone at this time. The founder of Nga Hau Mangere also said it was her understanding that Birthcare was given a promise by the CMDHB that it would be given the first right to tender for primary maternity services, and that is why her service has been denied a contract.

Some women who are resident in CM Health may receive postnatal care at Birthcare but this is through self initiated referral and is managed by inter-district flow (IDF) of funding between DHBs (just like any other treatment across DHB boundaries).

Lastly, would I be able to get the CMDHB's maternity health services annual report for the last year? Yes - it is on the website.

Dear Alan and Mary,

Alan, I am so pleased we could connect again. I found an email you sent to Wayne and I 28/9/17 commenting on our meeting back then and offering assistance in the future. Our conversation recently brought confirmation in a belief I have, that is there is no such thing as coincidence, only opportunity. Life's opportunities are all about timing. Thank you Mary for taking the time to look at this email, I hope we can meet very soon.

I would like to reiterate some points of our recent conversation.

My purpose for building Nga Hau and the other Centres we have built was to bring the level of support to mothers in areas of high need. Maori and Pasifika women in particular suffer high rates of maternity related mental and physical negative outcomes. We can discuss this further and the implications for mother - child - family - societal wellness, more fully.

Research and narrative demonstrate the 'working' system of maternity support is failing our people, our communities.

It may have been somewhat audacious to move forward to bring a model of care that can be seen to make a massive difference in lives but we have waited too long. Every life matters.

My concept was to get a model up and running, show the need, and as has happened at Midcentral (Palmerston North) the Board of MidCentral voted overwhelmingly to take over the lease and operation of Te Papaioea with a Memorandum of Understanding with the Wright Family Foundation to continue with the nongovernment funded wrap around services the Foundation already brings to the partnership. (To be shared). We did not approach Midcentral with this, they asked us.

One of the major benefits to midwifery has been the ability to rotate midwives between the DHB secondary unit to the purpose built primary facility. It is seen as a win, win situation. Secondary facility midwives experience the environment of the primary unit which has been described by Midcentral as a respite and which they are trained for, and the midwives at the primary unit can learn more of intervention and practice of a secondary setting. We have a strong connection to AU to mentor student midwives to recognize midwifery practice.

We are a charity as the operation of birthing centres were never meant to be a long term responsibility of the Wright Family Foundation. With the growing call from LMCs and mothers to birth at Nga Hau, I understand the statistics show more women are birthing at Nga Hau than two other DHB primary units. Built on the edge of Mangere Town Centre, Nga Hau is perfectly placed for a growing population who find travel to other units problematic.

As Midcentral told us, they could never have built a centre like Te Papaioea but in taking over the lease they have been able to give so many more women and families the care and support they deserve. It has been our experience midwives do not leave the profession unless moving from the area. Wayne and I will be in Auckland on Friday the 7th and would greatly appreciate an opportunity to meet with you Alan, Mary, and Jon Baulcomb. If this does not suit you could you give us a couple of options that do suit

Thanks for the responses of low; I have had contact now with many people on the subject.

Can I please request we are referred to as a charitable social enterprise , we are not a private company. In light of our status I would ask for the funding request to be reviewed.

Over the lockdown period we were advised our centres had to stay open as 'essential services'; meaning we stayed open, provided appropriate staffing levels, and bore the cost of operating a centre in lockdown. The Mangere birthing centre also assisted the local community LMCs when they found they were unable to access their normal clinic rooms. Nga Hau Birthing Centre provided a safe space for clinics for the LMCs over this time at little cost.

Because we provided that support to the local community and the cost has had to be funded from Donations, we would have thought Manukau DHB would have been amenable in coming to the party with some basic funding over this period of time.

Were we told we were not required to be open at the time, we would have closed and saved that cost. This would have also put tremendous pressure on your midwifery community in Mangere which would have become your problem.

Thank you also for your correspondence on 3rd October. I apologise for delays in responding while I checked with my staff on any changes to our position. I am also in receipt of your invoice for services received by us on 3 October 2019. Again, as I said when we met in August, I am not in a position to support payment of an invoice for services not requested by our DHB nor supported by an existing contract or Memorandum of Understanding.

Further to your request and the proposal in your email below (23 October 2019), the Government rules for the procurement of services by DHBs are clear. They are designed to ensure there is open competition, processes are aligned across the country and all aspects of health and safety legislation, clinical credentialing and accreditation and appropriate clinical service delivery models are adhered to. Important tenets such as anti-corruption and conflict of interest rules are also key to guiding this process. We have

not yet undertaken any such due diligence in respect of new primary birthing units and are currently reviewing all our Women's Health strategies.

I was overly optimistic on the timeframes required to have such a process in place and, it is unlikely that we will have sought Board endorsement of a wider Maternity strategy that includes the directions for primary birthing, the arrangements (including tenders) for its implementation in this 19/20 financial year. This is because we are in the process of transitioning to a new Board and will be refreshing our approach to Maternity strategically in the District in context of change to s.88 Maternity Notice.

I am not in a position to offer your organisation a Memorandum of Intent or agreement at this point in time in light of the requirements mentioned above.

I do wish to thank you and Dianne for sharing information that may enable rapid implementation when we get to that point. I will revise the timeframes and make this available publicly to the sector before the end of the year. I am sorry this is not the news you may have expected.

Out of concern for our mothers and LMCs/midwives, over the Christmas – New Year period, I am writing to consult with you on a proposal that the Nga Hau Mangere Birthing Centre will close from Friday 20th of December 2019 until the Monday 6th January 2020.

We currently have 18 women booked in and around that period and subject to the outcome of consultation, we will refer these women and their LMCs to your facility for the duration of the closure.

We have always seen ourselves as a solution to the stresses put on secondary institutions, including the benefits of sharing midwifery staff. It is of great concern to us that women's legal entitlement of at least 48 hours of postnatal care after primary births plus longer care for complicated births in a setting that permits fathers to stay and support the family is not always being met. Multiple studies confirm that the first 48 hours are crucial to the attachment between mother and baby and for the long term mental and physical health of both.

We are aware that our services have been beneficial and, in some cases critical, to many families in your DHB area. LMCs and mothers are increasingly requesting to birth/postnatal at Nga Hau, particularly given the hardships of lack of transport and family connection.

As CEO of the Wright Family Foundation, the sole funder of Nga Hau Mangere Birthing Centre, I have a fiduciary responsibility to the WFF Board to ensure this initiative is sustainable through a healthy partnership with your DHB. Our stated goal is to bring best outcomes for mothers, and to bring attention to the need for change to the care and support of new mothers.

I look forward to your feedback on this proposal by close of day Tuesday 29th October 2019.

Thank you for agreeing to meet with myself, Dianne Mulhern CEO, and Tish at Nga Hau recently. We respectfully request that you consider a contract that financially supports primary birthing and/or postnatal stays at the purpose built facility Nga Hau Mangere Birthing Centre, which is only minutes away from Middlemore Hospital. As we explained when you visited us at Nga Hau, we are part of the solution to the challenges your service face. We value the strong community support and interest in our service.


